

We import specialty coffee from Colombia to Europe

Doris María Cacais, Finca Los Aguacates, China Alta - Tolima

We proudly present our very first lot from MUJERES – our coffee selection from female farmers.

Our lot has been collected in two areas of the farm Los Aguacates called Los Barrancos (1,5ha) and Lote del Monte (1ha) - about 5000 trees per hectare. This coffee of variety *Colombia* was first fermented 12hours in cherry after it was de-pulped and fermented another 24h in mucilage, then washed and dried 18 days in covered drying beds (marquesinas).

General information about the farm

The farm itself, called Los Aguacates, is a family farm of a total area about 17ha, from which about 3ha are kept as a natural reserve. As it is very common in many other similar family farms in Colombia, the area is divided into small "lots" and administered by different family members. One could say those are sort of small farms within a farm. Doris María, the lady in charge of the household, is responsible for two areas of land called "Los Barrancos" (1,5ha) and "Lote del Monte" (1ha) - about 5000 trees per hectare. (The second name sounds a bit funny to those understanding the Spanish language especially the Latin American slang - "monte" means an area of nature full of bushes, trees, grass, simply without a visible trace of the human hand.)

What did Doris tell us about herself?

"Buenos días, my name is Doris María Cacais of the indigenous origins, mother of seven children, the second generation of coffee producers. I am in love with the coffee and thanks God and the coffee I could take my children forward."
